DID YOU KNOW ...

BATTERIES RECYCLING We keep hearing that we should not put batteries from hearing aids, flashlights etc, in the garbage. We now have a box for recycling these items in the lounge by the front desk on the retirement side. When there are enough, we'll take them to the Kemptville Youth Club on Oxford St. for re-cycling. They also take used telephones. Thank you.

*Do you know about the mauve colored Ontario photo ID card? This card is available to anyone who doesn't have a driver's licence - seniors who no longer drive, young people who don't drive yet, or folks who are unable to drive. This ID card does not provide for operation of a motor vehicle, but does provide for everything else a drivers licence does - i.e. bank ID, voting, police checks, airports, etc., anything where you need photo ID but where health cards aren't accepted. It lasts for 5 years, costs \$35.00, doesn't require a test and is available at any Ontario Drivers' licensing agent. Kemptville office is at #10 Campus Drive, near the hospital. You just need to identify yourself with a birth certificate, your health card and a legal signature document.

*Another little known item of interest is insurance provision for seniors who are living in a seniors' residence or nursing home and require fire insurance and indemnity. This is similar to the provision for students at college who can be covered under their parent's policy. The one for seniors covers them under the policy of one of their children as a rider.

This year Bayfield Manor has partnered up with the North Grenville Art Guild for our annual Craft & Bake Sale which will be on Saturday, December 1st from 1:30 to 4pm in the dining room on LTC.

This year's focus will be more in selling baked goods and displaying amazing art work (which will also be for sale) done by local artists in the community.
