Rate Increase**

You will be receiving very shortly the official notification of the increase in the accommodation charges announced on May 28 by the Ministry of Health. This is the annual increase which takes place at this time of the year and which amounts to 2.3% for 2019. The increase will be effective on July 1 and will be reflected on your monthly invoice.

**UPDATE ON EXPANSION**

As I'm sure you know, the Ministry announced earlier this year that they have awarded Bayfield 94 new LTC beds. The official announcement was held on March 13<sup>th</sup> and was attended by Kemptville Mayor Nancy Peckford and MPP Steve Clark along with Keith McIntosh from Southbridge.

Plans are being developed to build a new 3 story wing in the first phase, and to either rebuild or redevelop the current LTC building in the second stage. There is no timetable established at this time and there will be a number of approval processes to complete at the Ministry and municipal levels before construction can begin.

Be assured we will keep you informed of any developments as we move this exciting project forward.

On May 10th the staff at Bayfield participated in a BSO transfer inservice provided by Sarah Crawford and Merushe Shanks. The staff had to wear distorted goggles and noise altering head phones, they were then transferred inappropriately in and out of bed using the mechanical lift. The purpose of the inservice was to let the staff feel the fear and disorientation associated with transferring and the importance of explaining step by step what is being done to each residents therefore making them feel more safe and secure.
